Our teachers prepare for conferences by observing and reflecting on each child's interests, progress, and areas for growth. We welcome parents as active participants in conferences, so here are some tips you may find helpful.

- Conferences will take place onsite in your child's classroom.
- <u>Be willing and ready to share information about your child and family</u>. You know your child better than anyone else, and we respect and value your insights and perspective. Please share any information that may be helpful.
- <u>Stay focused on your child</u>. We each have our own ideas about teachers and their role, shaped by our own school experiences. Reflecting on these and then putting aside past experiences as a student, opens up space for staying focused on your child's unique temperament, special interests, and individual needs.
- <u>Our Parent-Teacher Conferences are mandatory</u>. If your schedule does not work with the times that are available on the Sign-up Genius, please make other arrangements with your child's teacher.
- <u>Arrive on time</u>. The schedule can be tight for conferences. If you would like additional time, ask for it in advance so that you and the teachers will have plenty of time to discuss your ideas, suggestions, and concerns. We make every attempt to stay on time, and we appreciate your patience.
- Our Parent-Teacher Conferences are for adults only. Young children can get mixed messages when they hear others talking about them, even when the conversation is positive. Please make other child care arrangements for your child(ren).
- <u>Listen with an open mind</u>. Speak up when you have a concern about a strategy or don't
 understand how it will support your child's development. Be open to suggestions and be willing
 to provide possibilities of your own.
- <u>Be prepared</u>. You may wish to write down your questions prior to the conference, to ensure they don't get lost in the conversation.
- <u>Understand that we must observe confidentialities</u>. If there is a problem you would like to
 discuss, we ask that you keep it about your child. We are not able to share information with
 you about other children in the class.
- We desire to work in partnership with you. Parent-Teacher Conferences only take place twice a
 year, but positive relationship building is ongoing. Please let us know any time you have
 questions, concerns, suggestions, or information to share. Meetings with teachers can be
 scheduled as needed. As we hope you have experienced, teachers are available by e-mail,
 Brightwheel, and can return phone calls. Please let us know how we can best support you.

Help Us Play Outside Each Day!

Here in New Mexico, our sunny skies and fairly mild weather make it possible for children to play outside year round. This benefits children tremendously, as we know the importance of



daily outside play. Not only does playing outside support strong immune systems, but when children play outside, even in colder weather, they have opportunities to problem solve, engage with others, build language skills, and have fun! When children play outside in cold weather, they:

- Build strong immune systems and resistance to allergies. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, "Cold weather does not cause colds or flu. The viruses that cause colds and flu tend to be more common in the winter, when children are in school and are in closer contact with each other indoors." Playing outside allows children to be in the fresh air, away from bacteria and viruses. It also allows for children to be exposed to sand, plants, and elements of nature, which helps to build up their immunities.
- Reap the benefits of exercise. Running, swinging, climbing, spinning, jumping, balancing, throwing and catching, leaping, and more, build body awareness, strength, and large muscle coordination.
- <u>Use their imaginations</u>. A child's natural sense of wonder and curiosity abounds in rich outdoor environments.
- <u>Benefit from Vitamin D</u>. Experts recommend 15 minutes a day for a supply of Vitamin D that can build memory and boost energy and mood.

In keeping with our policy of daily outside play (see Family Handbook), we wish to assure you that we always use our best judgment. Children's safety is our highest priority, so we give consideration to the temperature, the wind chill, and the precipitation. You can help us by making sure your child is dressed and prepared to spend time outside each and every day.

- Dress your child in layers.
- Provide a jacket that offers warmth for a period of time, not just for a dash from the car into the building.
- Provide a hat, mittens, scarf and weather appropriate shoes.
- Label all items with your child's name, so we can keep winter wear with its correct owner!


Throughout November, we will be singing "God Is So Good". You and your child may wish to sing it together.

- Please clean and disinfect lunch boxes and water bottles daily.


Illness Policy

Thank you for your help with the health and wellness of the preschool community.

Together we make a difference!

- Send a Brightwheel message or an e-mail to <u>both</u> Lori and Jane <u>any</u> time your child will be absent, even if he/ she is not sick, as we are required to track absences. Lori — stlukesc@thuntek.net Jane — stlukepreschool1956@gmail.com
- In order to return to the preschool following illness, children (and staff) must be:
 fever free (without medication), diarrhea free, and vomiting free for 24 hours, and able to
 participate in the school day successfully with respect to energy level and engagement.
 Children with excessive amounts of mucus and coughing should remain at home to help
 minimize illness at the preschool.

If your child becomes ill while at school, you will be called to pick him/ her up within 30 minutes of receiving the call. Please be sure to keep your local contact information updated with us. If we are unable to get in touch with a parent, we will continue calling down the list of emergency contacts until we reach someone.

NAEYC Standard 4: Assessment of Child Progress

This is good timing for taking a look at NAEYC Standard 4, as we will soon be participating in Parent - Teacher Conferences! This standard states that "the program is informed by ongoing systematic, formal, and informal assessment approaches to provide information on children's learning and development. These assessments occur within the contexts in which children develop. Assessment results are used to benefit children by informing sound decisions about children, teaching, and program improvement."

At St. Luke, our observational assessments incorporate the NAEYC criteria as well as the New Mexico Early Learning Standards. As teachers gather knowledge about each child, they are able to plan appropriately and tailor the instruction to respond to the child's needs and strengths. Assessment is also essential for identifying children who may need additional developmental evaluation, may benefit from intervention, or who need more intensive instruction. All assessment information is kept confidential by staff.
