Financial Assistance

Each year, tuition assistance is given to a few students at St. Luke Preschool, based on financial need. To apply, please see Lori for more information and an application. Along with the application, the following supporting documentation is required to be submitted.

- The previous year's tax return
- Monthly income and expense budget

Applications are due by **Tuesday, April 1, 2025** for the 2025-2026 School Year. Tuition assistance is not available for Summer Preschool.

All requests, financial information, and determination are kept strictly confidential.

*Parents or another adult guardian must accompany each child at all times. Teachers will be in attendance, but will not be responsible for supervising children at the park that day.

*Children are encouraged to wear their St. Luke t-shirts.

*Please bring sunscreen, hats, drinks, and any park toys that you would like to bring. You are welcome to bring snacks and/or lunch for your family, but we ask you not to bring food to share, since children with food allergies will be in attendance.

*The splash pad may be open, so please come prepared if you'd like your child to play in the water. Clothes that can get wet, water shoes, and a towel will be important!

*Families can come and go as they would like.

Enjoying our park time together gives us the opportunity for conversation, well wishes, thank yous and some good-byes. We hope you will join us!

Illness Policy

Thank you for your help with the health and wellness of the preschool community. Together we make a difference!

- Send a Brightwheel message or an e-mail to <u>both</u> Lori and Jane <u>any</u> time your child will be absent, even if he/ she is not sick, as we are required to track absences. Lori — stlukesc@thuntek.net Jane — stlukepreschool1956@gmail.com Be sure to let us know your child's symptoms.
- In order to return to the preschool following illness, children (and staff) must be: fever free (without medication), diarrhea free, and vomiting free for 24 hours, and able to participate in the school day successfully with respect to energy level and engagement. Children with excessive amounts of mucus and coughing should remain at home to help minimize illness at the preschool.

If your child becomes ill while at school, you will be called to pick him/ her up within 30 minutes of receiving the call. Please be sure to keep your local contact information updated with us. If we are unable to get ahold of a parent, we will continue calling down the list of emergency contacts until we reach someone.
